The Third Annual Carnegie Mellon Conference has two themes:

Our first theme examines how to get an adequate amount of capacity of the right technologies for generation, transmission and distribution over the next three decades. Sub-themes are investment in a restructured world, addressing capacity markets, and ensuring that adequate capacity is always available. We welcome authors exploring both current schedule issues and investment issues.

For our second theme, we welcome authors exploring the current quantity and quality of undergraduate power engineering education. Contributors may explore paying for this education, what should be taught, and how to attract the most capable people. We also welcome contributions on MS and PhD level education and well as the training of skilled blue collar workers.

A conference registration fee will cover a reception on March 12, breakfast and lunch on the 13 and 14, and a reception and dinner on the 13. The registration fee is \$75 for individuals from University, government, and non-profit organiza-tions and \$250 from individuals from for-profit organizations.
